
Kindergarten Readiness Assessment (KRA) Results

Section 59-152-33 requires the adoption and administration of a Kindergarten Readiness Assessment

Proviso 1A.58 requires each entering Kindergarten student to participate in the KRA within the first 45 days of school

EOC staff have reported on the KRA findings since the 2017-18 school year
